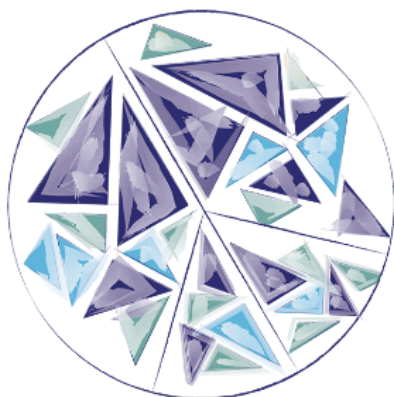

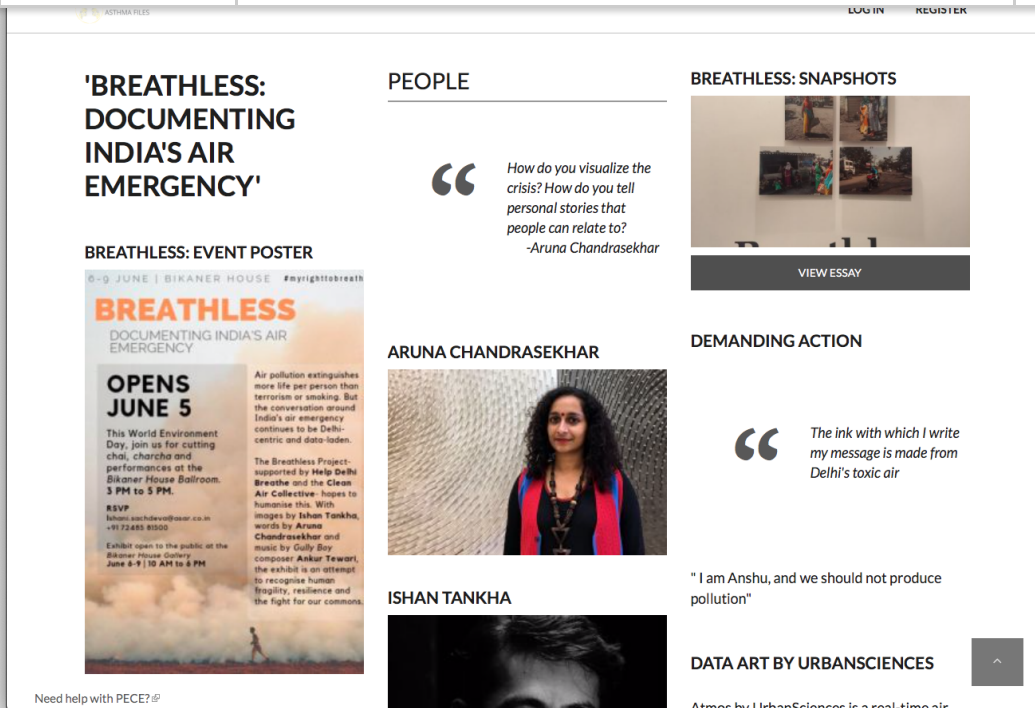

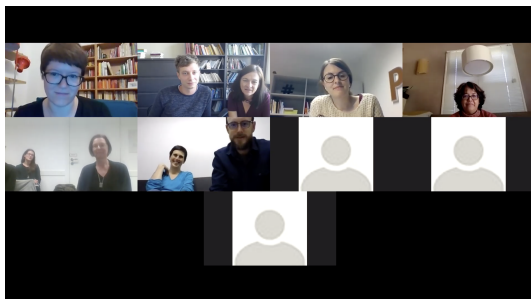
Featured PECE Essay
